

Dr. Howard Chertkow Featured by News Outlets Following Health Canada Announcement



Health Canada recently announced the approval of Lecanemab (brand name Leqembi), which is the first drug that can slow the progression of early-stage Alzheimer's disease. Baycrest senior scientist, Dr. Howard Chertkow, provided commentary and context about the announcement on several news programs including CBC and CityNews, both in print and video stories. Baycrest Marks Holocaust Education Week

From November 3 through 7, Baycrest marked Holocaust Education Week, a time to remember, reflect and reaffirm our shared commitment to never forget. As home to the largest group of Holocaust survivors in Canada, Baycrest honours their stories, preserves their legacy and ensures that the lessons of their lives continue to be heard and shared.

We marked Holocaust Education Week with a series of events:

- Talks by Holocaust survivors Baycrest welcomed survivors each day of Holocaust Education Week. They spoke movingly and honestly about their lives and experiences, reminding everyone how important it is not to forget the atrocities of the Holocaust, and to identify and repudiate hatred and bigotry whenever and wherever we find it. Baycrest was also pleased to have nearly 500 students from local schools join us for the survivor talks, to educate and engage the next generation in creating a more inclusive world.
- Art in the Holocaust was a self-guided art exhibition on display throughout the week in the Silverman Garden Court. Art in the Holocaust shared a selection of artworks from the Yad Vashem (World Holocaust Remembrance Centre) Collection. The artworks were created by 20 artists during the Holocaust (1939-1945) and reflect the tension between the inclination to document the terrible events endured and the desire to break free through art. The works stand as testimony to the human spirit that refuses to surrender.





• The Sign that Tells a Story: Survival, Memory and Community - Michael Ferman, Baycrest's Director of Heritage and Spiritual Care, shared the story of his grandparents, Lewis and Grunia Ferman who are Holocaust survivors, and how the rediscovery of their Lewis Ferman & Co. sign revealed a powerful story of survival and renewal and is now preserved at The Rooms, Newfoundland's provincial museum.
