VBM Eligibility Criteria for Referral Checklist

Before referring to the Virtual Behavioural Medicine (VBM) program, please ensure your patient meets the following criteria:



Required Eligibility Criteria

Diagnosis of Dementia

- Patient with a confirmed diagnosis or strongly suspected diagnosis of dementia.
- Primary concern is the presence of severe unmanaged neuropsychiatric symptoms, such as as aggression, agitation, hallucinations, and paranoia.





Consent from a Power of Attorney (POA), Substitute Decision Maker (SDM), or Public Guardian and Trustee (PGT)

 Consent from a Power of Attorney (POA) or PGT, or Substitute Decision Maker (SDM) is required, as patients are incapable of making healthcare decisions at this stage.





Stable Medical Condition

- Patients should be stable from a general medical perspective.
- Exceptions may apply for those referred while in acute care.





Additional Factors for Considering a Referral to VBM



Risk of Harm

• Patient exhibiting neuropsychiatric symptoms/responsive behaviours that present a risk of harm to themselves or others due to dementia-related symptoms.





Transition to New Care Setting

• Patient transitioning to another sector or place of care where neuropsychiatric symptoms/responsive behaviours may pose a barrier to a successful transition.





Tertiary Specialized Behaviour Support Beds (CASS Beds)

• Patient for whom an application for a CASS bed is being considered.
