Clinical Observation Information

Clinical Observations will take place in the following areas:

Sam and Ida Ross Memory Clinic

The learner(s) will observe the interprofessional care team (nurse, physician, medical residents/fellows) as they provide assessment and management to outpatients with memory disorders. The memory disorders clinic sees clients who are experiencing changes in memory, language and/or behaviour. Learners will be exposed to assessment, treatment and management strategies specific to this area.

Behavioral Neurology Program

The learner(s) will observe team rounds on the in-patient short stay secure unit. They will be exposed to the different interprofessional team members working on this program. The program offers a specialized interdisciplinary service that focuses on diagnosis, assessment and treatment of complex neurological diseases and associated behavioral symptoms.

The Samuel Lunenfeld Mountainview Club

Learners will observe the club members as they interact in social-recreational programs. Learners will also observe the strategies employed by the staff to identify and mitigate responsive behaviours and to engage clients in meaningful activities.

Behavioral Support for Seniors Program

Learners will meet with members of the interprofessional team and observe residents participating in recreational programs on the Long-Term Care Transitional Behavioural Support Unit, a short stay secure unit.

The Chief Nurse will observe a member of the community outreach team on visit(s) to clients' homes.
